

## U.S. Military Spending vs. The World

- U.S. military spending is 7 times that of China, the second largest spender.
- The U.S. military budget is 29 times that of the six "rogue" states combined (Cuba, Iran, Libya, North Korea, Sudan and Syria).
- The UN and all its agencies and funds spend about \$10 billion each year, less than 2% of the U.S. military budget.
- As of November 30, 2005, UN members' arrears to the Regular Budget topped \$695 million, of which the United States alone owed \$587 million.

## U.S. Foreign Military Aid

- The U.S. foreign military aid budget for 2006 is \$4.5 billion.
- The Foreign Military Financing program (FMF), increased by 68% between 2001 and 2003.
- The number of countries receiving FMF assistance went from 48 in 2001 to 71 in 2006.
- Between 1950 and 2005, the U.S. government has provided over \$121 billion in FMF to militaries around the world.
- Not included in these figures is economic aid, which often becomes de facto military aid, with foreign governments using the funds to free up their own resources for military programs.
- Israel had been the largest recipient of U.S. foreign assistance for almost 30 years.
- U.S. foreign military financing makes up 20% of Israel's defense budget
