




## MAY-JUNE 2012 FILM PROGRAM in collaboration with Associazione Culturale Arcobaleno

May 17 – **Standing Army** (2010). 73 min. Directed by two young Italian filmmakers, this film focuses on the U.S. global web of military bases, investigating why the number of U.S. bases around the world keeps rising — often overriding opposition from the communities affected. This exploration is enriched by words from prominent experts and ex-insiders including Noam Chomsky, Gore Vidal, and those directly affected in Italy, Japan, the Indian Ocean and elsewhere. **► Co-director Thomas Fazi will be present at the screening.**





May 31 – **Waltz with Bashir** (2008). 87 min. An Israeli film director interviews fellow veterans of the 1982 invasion of Lebanon to reconstruct his own memories of his term of service in that conflict. As the director Ari Folman delves deeper and deeper into the mystery, his memory begins to creep up in surreal images. This extraordinary animated feature-length documentary, which has won many awards, premiered at Cannes and is banned in some Arab countries (including Lebanon). An unforgettable film to be seen and seen again.



June 14 – **A new day has "com"** (2010). 56 min. This documentary film directed by Emiliano Sacchetti, tackles one of the less known aspects of the Palestinian diaspora: the exodus of 20,000 refugees displaced from Baghdad as a retaliation by the militia right after the fall of Saddam Hussein. It gracefully tells the stories of two families that are "deported" to the Al Tanf refugee camp in the middle of the Syrian desert and the futures that two different, distant European countries offer them thousands of kilometers from their motherland.
