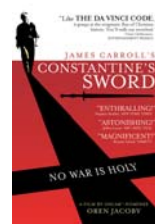

Sept 12 – **9/11: Explosive Evidence - Experts Speak Out** (2012). Architects & Engineers for 9/11 Truth show scientific evidence that three of the World Trade Center buildings collapsed on September 11, 2001 from controlled demolitions using explosives, not from the impact by the two jets and resulting fires. A new independent study is needed to aid US security and the victims.



Sept 26 – **Constantine's Sword** (2008). James Carroll narrates this film about his book which analyses the dark side of Christianity and the origins of European anti-Semitism. Filmed mainly in Rome, it also exposes religious efforts to influence American armed forces and warns of the dangerous consequences of military power joined with religious fanaticism.



Oct 10 – **Bananas!*** (2011). The unjust politics of food are probed in this film that investigates the use of a banned pesticide alleged to have sterilized many banana plantation workers in Nicaragua. The Swedish director who produced **Big Boys Gone Bananas!** in 2012, focuses on the landmark legal case of these poor workers versus Dole Food Corp.



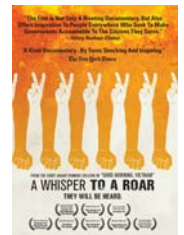
Oct 24 – **Aghet: A Genocide** (2010). This bold German film uses archival footage and eye witness reports to depict the systematic annihilation of 1.5 million Armenians from 1915 to 1923 and Turkey's continuing official policy of genocide denial. Will this old atrocity ever be reprimanded? It is yet another brutal reminder that crimes against humanity continue.



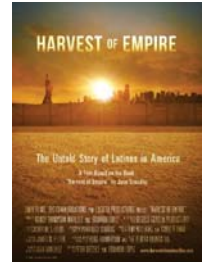
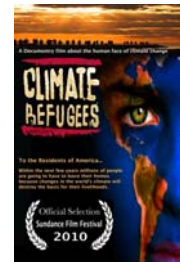
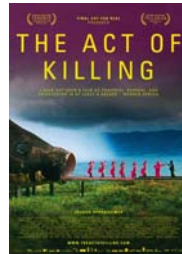
Nov 7 – **Roadmap to Apartheid** (2011). (Sottotitoli in Italiano) The directors take a detailed look at an apartheid analogy and the complex Israel-Palestine conflict. They highlight the frighteningly similar laws and tools used by Israel and apartheid-era South Africa. It's a dark picture but is, according to Archbishop Tutu, "very powerful and compelling".



Nov 21 – **A Whisper to a Roar** (2012). This riveting film offers inspiration to people everywhere who seek to make their governments accountable to the citizens they serve. It recounts the heroic stories of struggle by brave democracy activists under past and present autocratic rule in five countries (Zimbabwe, Malaysia, Ukraine, Venezuela and Egypt).
