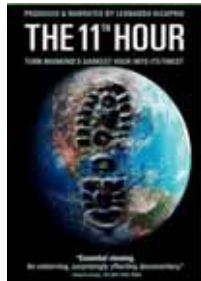

Feb 19 – **The 11<sup>th</sup> Hour** (2007)  
Narrated by Leonardo DiCaprio, this film explores the perilous state of our planet and the means by which we can change our course. Contributing to this crucial plea are noted politicians, scientists and other ambassadors who help explain the need for a universal ecological consciousness.



Mar 5 – **The End of America** (2008) Best-selling author Naomi Wolf's profound and eye-opening film looks at disturbing historical fascist similarities as she examines America's dangerous passage towards becoming a society of fear and surveillance, and advocates activism to restore the US's most cherished values.



Mar 19 – **Blood and Oil** (2008)  
With declassified documents and forgotten presidential doctrines, this film shows that oil has been at the core of US foreign policy for more than 60 years, rendering its energy and military policies virtually indistinguishable. The film calls for a radical re-thinking of US energy policy as Iraq war begins 7<sup>th</sup> year!



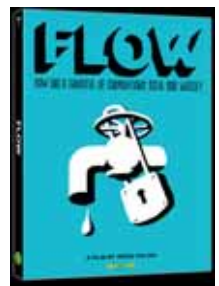

Apr 16 – **I.O.U.S.A.** (2008) The filmmakers claim it "boldly examines the rapidly growing national debt and its consequences for the USA" and propose solutions "to recreate a fiscally sound nation." Economist Dean Baker instead calls it the "failed scare flick of the decade" and The Nation says it's part of the plan to dismantle Social Security. See the film and decide for yourself.



Apr 30 – **Flow: For Love of Water** (2007)  
Award-winning film about the greatest threat of our time – the global water crisis. Flow highlights threats to water safety and builds a case against the growing privatization of dwindling fresh water with an unflinching focus on politics, pollution, human rights and the emergence of a domineering world water cartel.
